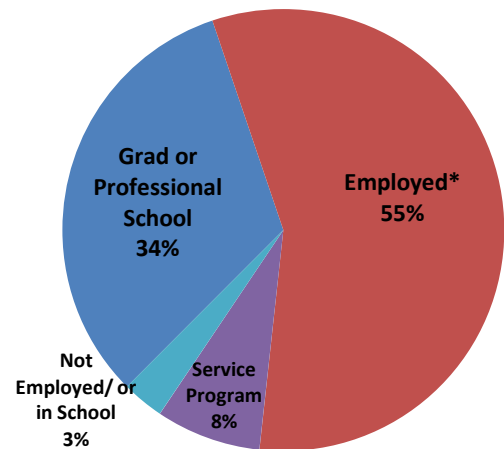

Alumnae/i Success and Outcomes

Dominican University not only provides students with a solid foundation to any further educational pursuits they may choose to follow, it also helps students develop skills that will prepare them for a global job market. Dominican graduates are desirable candidates as they search for employment or post-graduate education.



*Employed but not in school.

Outcomes include:

- 97% Success Rate**
 A total of 97% of students are employed, participating in a post-graduation service program (such as AmeriCorps or Dominican Volunteers), and/or attending graduate or professional school within a year of graduation.
- 34% Arts & Sciences Post-graduate Study Rate**
 More than 34% of the students in the College of Arts and Sciences pursue graduate or professional degrees immediately following their undergraduate programs. Some of the institutions they attend include Midwestern University, DePaul University, Olivet Nazarene University, and Dominican.
- Employment and Average Income**
 Over 56% of students are employed full-time within a year of graduation. The average entry-level income for these students is \$33,478.

Other Highlights of the 2013 Alumnae/i Follow-Up Study:

- A total of 94% of graduates state that they would recommend Dominican University to others.
- 91% of graduates indicate that Dominican has an atmosphere that is intellectually stimulating; with the large majority stating that they felt prepared to pursue their post-graduate career and education goals.
