

5. A place of gathering for students, location of the annual Dominican Fall Fest.
6. The original birthplace of Dominican University in Wisconsin, still home of the Dominican Sisters at the Mound.
8. Located on the northwest corner of campus, this area has been a quiet sanctuary for students and alumnae/i since 1929.
9. The location on campus that holds over 300,000 books.
11. The residence hall that houses freshmen students.
12. The name given to the college when moved to the current location in 1922.
13. The portion of Dominican's motto that means *truth*.
16. Dominican's mascot.

18. This dormitory housed the first students on campus, built in the 1920s. While renovations have been made, the structure of the building still remains untouched and resembles those rooms held by students a century ago.
19. The beloved Candle and Rose ceremony allows the graduating class to commemorate their time at Dominican in front of loved ones from this walk on campus.
