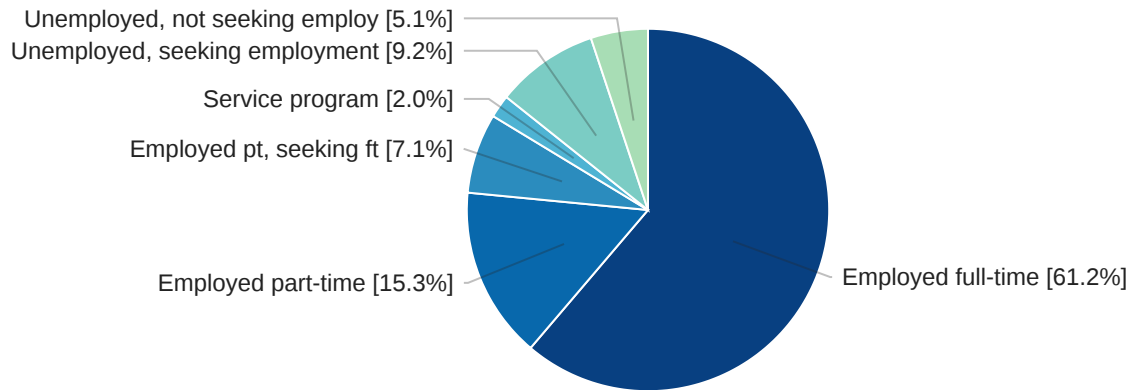

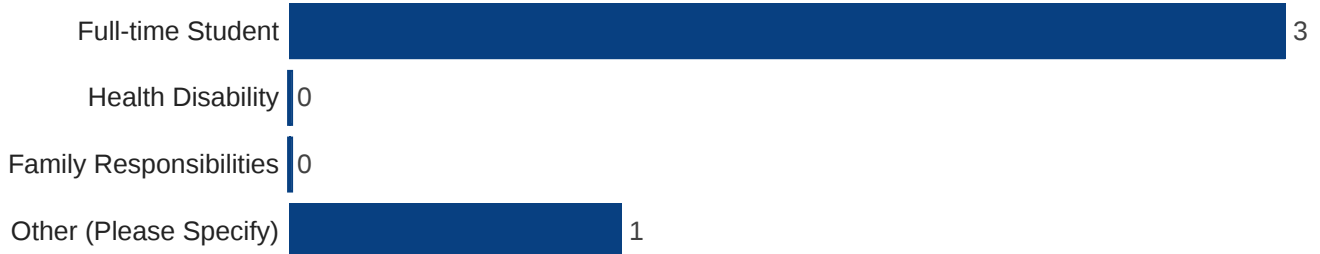

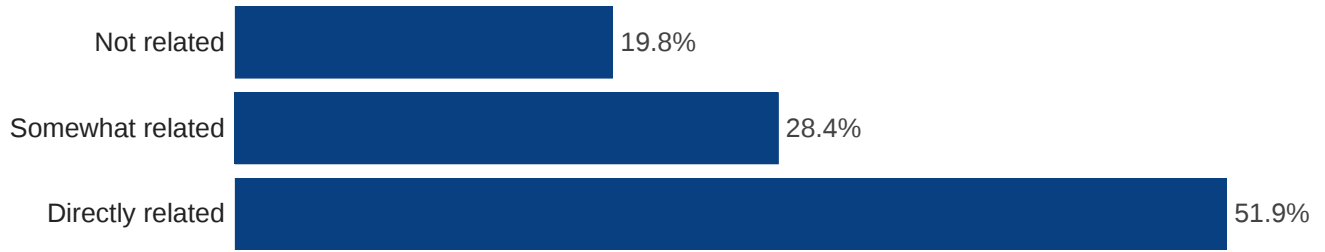

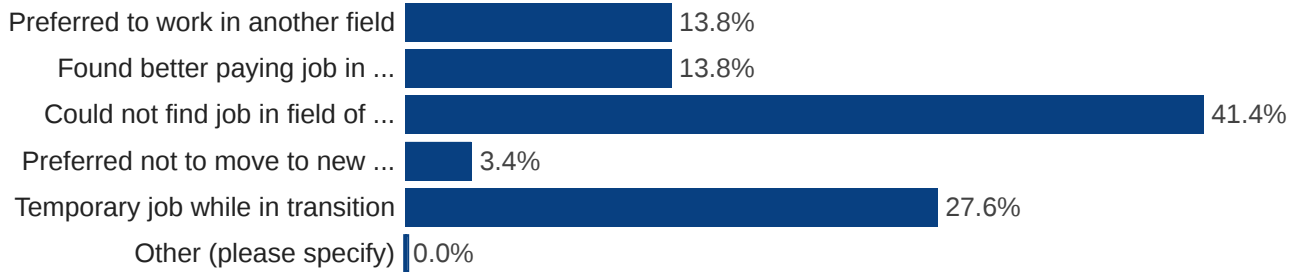

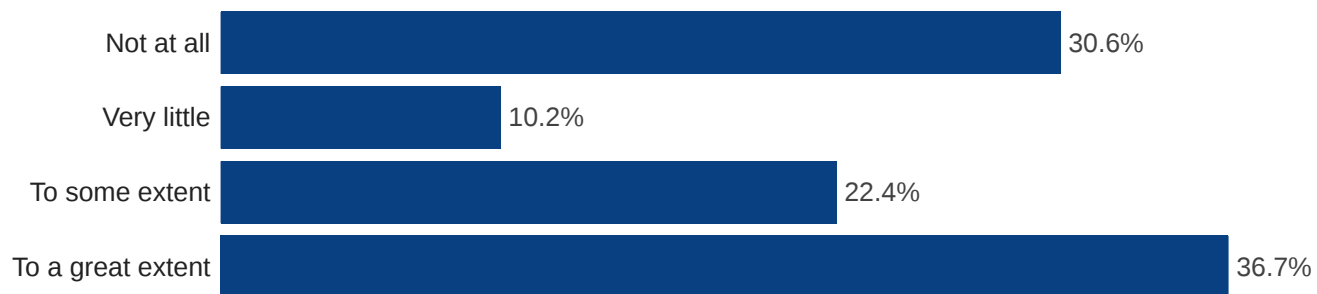

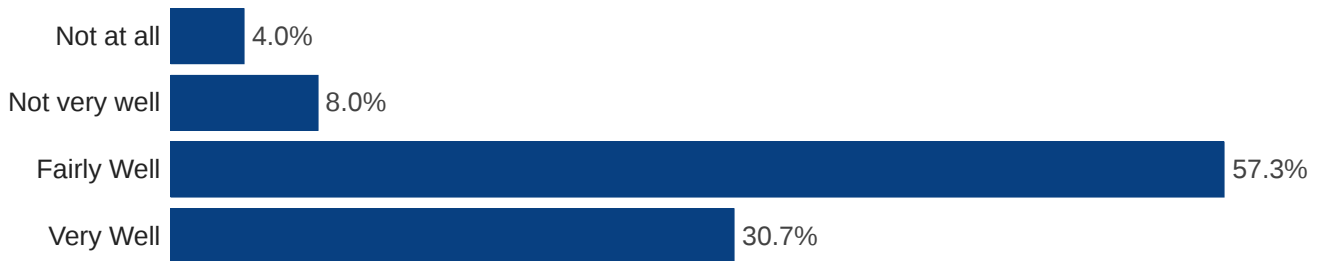

### To what extent did Dominican assist you in finding a job?



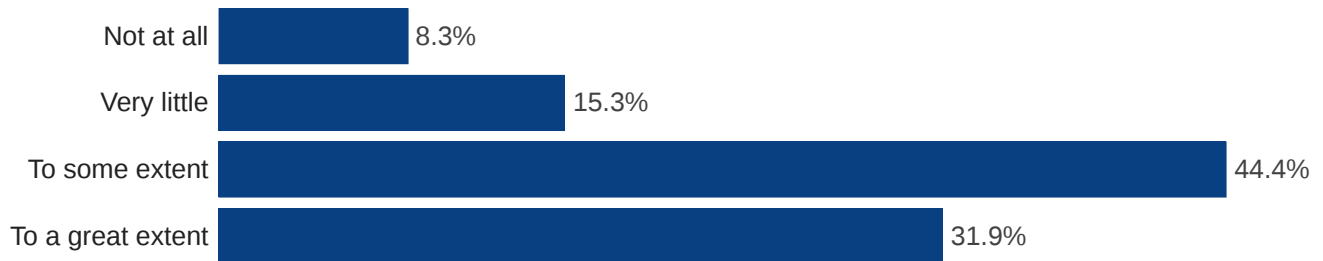

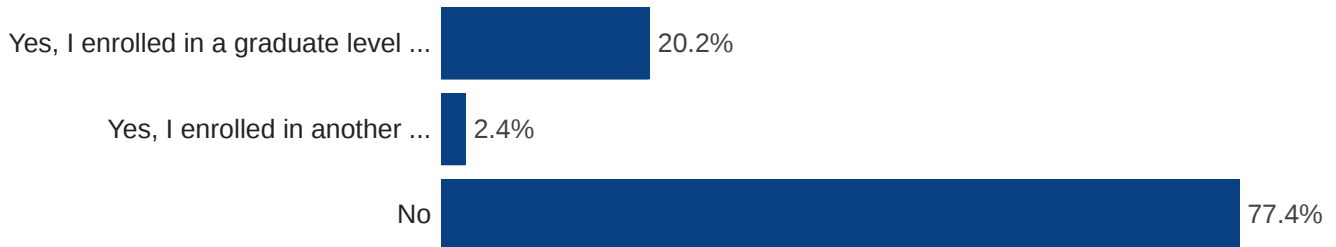

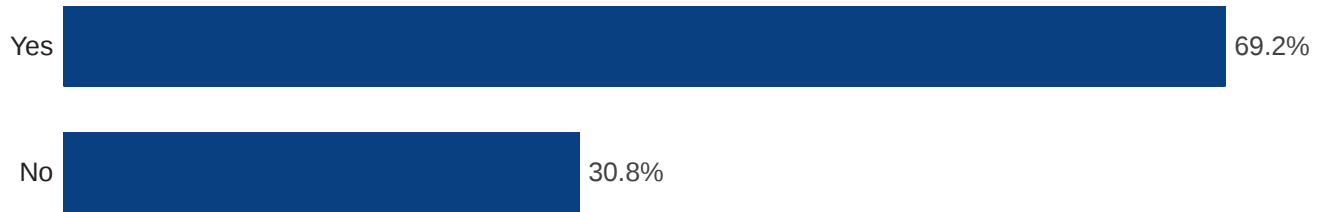

### Are you working on or have you attained another degree/certificate since graduating from Dominican?



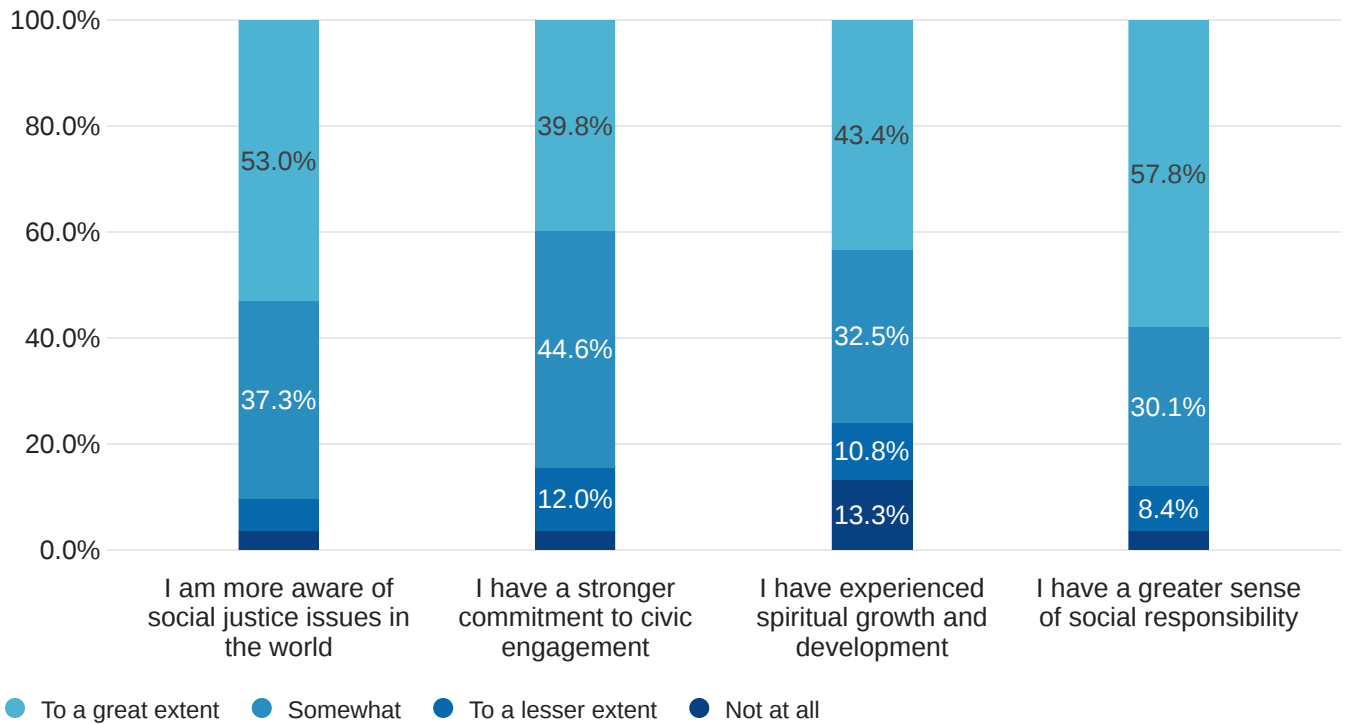

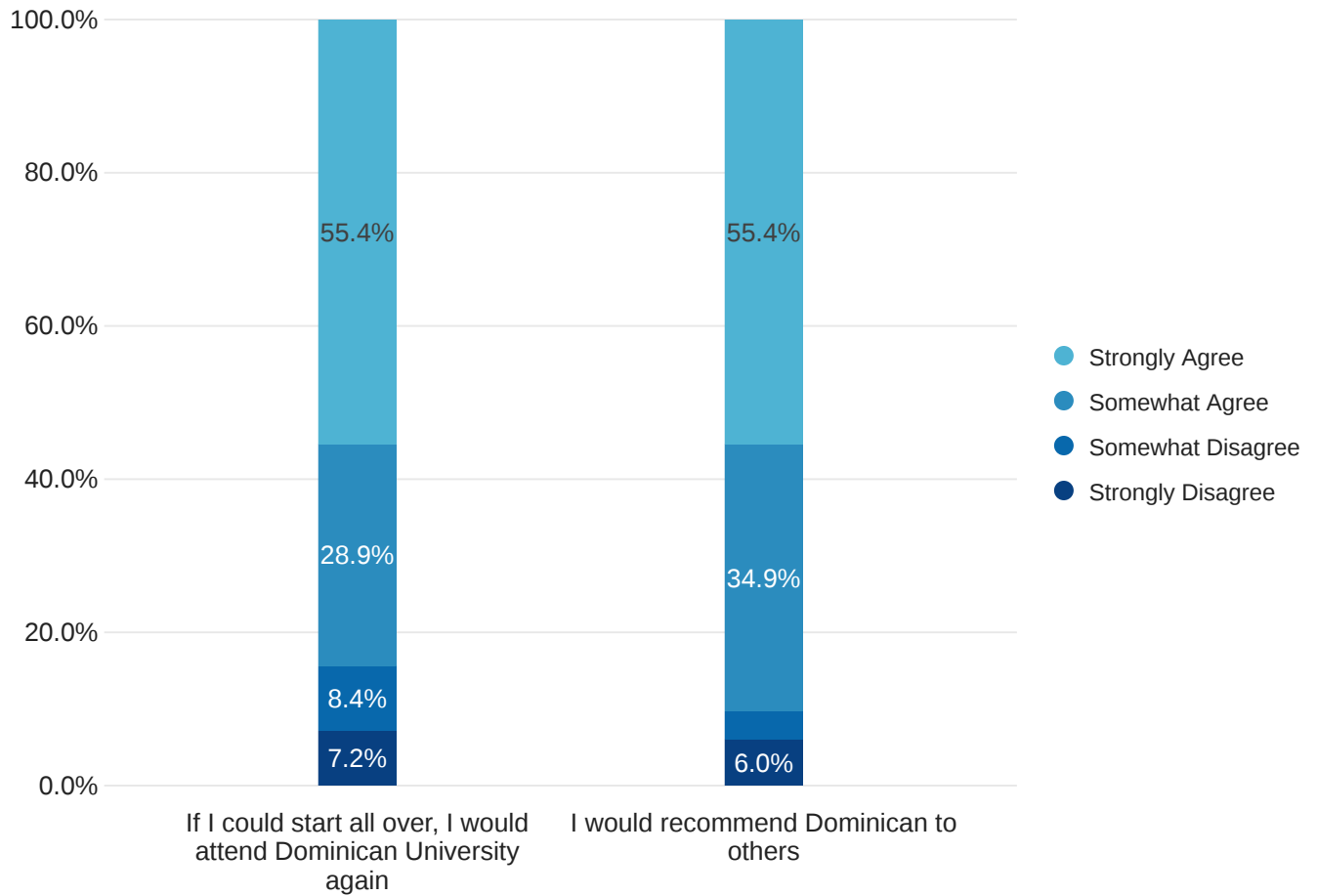
I also was a Theology minor and the other minors were really nice to be around when we had a retreat. The retreats are a great way to collaborate and bond with others.
