Dominican's advanced standing option allows students who have already earned a bachelor's degree in social work from a CSWEaccredited institution to complete the MSW in nine months.

Our advanced standing program requires you to complete 30 credit hours of coursework, including 20 hours per week of fieldwork and related field practicum courses (a total of 600 clock hours over two semesters.) You can complete the program in two years of part-time study or nine months of full-time study. You'll master the fundamentals of the profession: human behavior, community analysis, social welfare, and the nature and dynamics of family systems. You'll focus your studies by choosing a track in child welfare, gerontology, military social work, school social work, health and well-being, or working with immigrants and refugees. You'll be ready for leadership roles in a wide range of social work settings.

Social work today is a global profession. International concerns—such as immigration policies, refugee crises and economic dislocations—impact the lives of countless individuals and families. Dominican's program sets the standard for integrating global issues into the curriculum and for extending the social work discipline to communities around the world.
