



POLICIES ON AP CREDITS

Incoming Dominican students will be awarded course credit in the amounts indicated below as long as official Advanced Placement (AP) score reports are submitted prior to enrolling. Please refer to the College Board website for more information. There is no maximum of credit awarded through AP examination. An AP score of 3 or above will earn general elective credit at Dominican unless otherwise noted below.
