Students who do not meet the standards after a second term of enrollment are subject to financial aid suspension.  Exceeded 150% of the number of credits required to receive a degree.
Exceed 186 attempted credit hours to remain eligible for financial aid

Students who do not meet the federal standards will be notified, in writing, that they have been placed on financial aid probation. Students who do not meet the standards after a second term of enrollment are subject to financial aid suspension.

Students can also regain financial aid eligibility by returning to Financial Aid Standards of Satisfactory Academic Progress by taking courses at Dominican University, at their own expense and successfully completing a minimum of 6 credit hours with a 2.00 GPA.
